

South Australia has a long history in Olive Oil

In 1910 The [South Australian] Daily Herald praised olive oil as "an excellent food". "...in cooking", it continued, "it is regarded by experts in the culinary art as practically indispensable". Daily Herald 1910 "A few and favoured parts only of the globe can grow the olive . . . those parts that can, should grow the olive. South Australia can, therefore South Australia should grow it." Sir Samuel Davenport in a lecture to the Adelaide Chamber of manufactures in 1875.
